





































In Science, we planned a cold food picnic. We made a choice of sandwich filling and the juice that we wanted.

In Science, we have been watching our caterpillars grow. We have been enjoying The Hungry Caterpillar sensory story.








This term Earps class have been creating floorplans in Art.






We held a 'Guess the name of the Donkey' competition. Lots of pupils and staff had a go but the winner was Saif, who guessed the donkey's name was Poncho!

City-scapes: Gel Printing with Faye Maguire



















